





St. Thomas, known as Didymus or Twin, was one of the Twelve Apostles. Only the Evangelist John records his words (John 11:16, 14:5, 20:24-28). He is best known for demanding proof before he would believe the report of his fellow apostles that Jesus had risen from the dead, and also for his clear confession of Jesus' divinity ("my God") after seeing the risen Lord. He is said to have taken the Gospel to India, founding the Christian church in that country.
