

Psalmody Psalm 147

The verses are spoken antiphonally between the Pastor and Congregation.

(Antiphon) Praise the LORD, O Jerusalem; praise your God, O Zion.

as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, * forevermore. Amen.







Lord, have mer - cy up-on us.


