ANNOUNCEMENTS

Welcome! Emmanuel is an independent, liturgical, traditional, historical, evangelical, catholic, orthodox, confessional Lutheran congregation. We believe that the Bible is the very Word of God, inspired and without any errors. We confess the Christian faith according to the Lutheran Book of Concord of 1580 because we believe the confessions contained therein to be in accord with



the teaching of Holy Scripture. We observe the calendar of the traditional Church Year and follow the Historic Lectionary. We celebrate the Divine Service (also known as the Mass) every Sunday and on other festivals, and we welcome visitors to hear God's Word with us.

With regard to Holy Communion, we understand the Scriptures to teach *closed Communion*, which means that only communicant members of our congregation or of other congregations in communion with us are invited to commune at the Lord's Table here. Classes are offered throughout the year by the pastor so that those who are interested in becoming communicant members have the opportunity to learn about the Christian faith and our confession of it.

The Order of Service is printed in this booklet. The Propers (the parts that change from week to week) are noted in the Service Insert. Unless otherwise noted, the hymns are found in the red hymnal (*The Lutheran Hymnal*).

The Christmas Season lasts for 12 days, from December 25th through January 5th. We hear and celebrate the events surrounding the lowly birth of the Word made flesh, who took on human flesh in order to live and die as our Substitute. The color of the season is white for the purity and divinity of Christ.

The Epiphany Season begins on January 6th and lasts through the tenth Sunday before Easter, culminating in the Transfiguration of our Lord. We focus on various revelations of Jesus' hidden divinity during His earthly life, testifying that Jesus truly is the Christ, the Son of the living God. The color is white for the purity and divinity of Christ.

The Pre-Lenten Season comprises the three Sundays before the beginning of Lent. The names of the Sundays come from the Latin words for 70th, 60th, and 50th, a round method of counting down to Lent (40th) and then to Easter. The season prepares us for the "Lenten fast" by focusing on three key teachings: (1) How God's grace works, (2) how God's Word works, and (3) how faith receives God's work. The color is green for life, hope, and anticipation before entering the penitential season of Lent.





I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible.








THE LORD'S PRAYER
